Resources

Every once in a while we remember to let you all know about the resources which are available to you.

The club website <u>www.KarateAcademy.co.uk</u> has quite a lot of information on it, including a gallery page of photos, but hidden away at the bottom of the front page is a link to the top secret <u>Members Area</u>. When you click on this link it will tell you that you are not allowed to look at the page, then a pop-up appears asking for the password.

Currently the password is **Excellence**.

Now, on the Members site you can download newsletters, see more pictures, read the latest news and ask questions on the members only forum. Unlike so much "social networking" this forum is private and John Burke sensei has to approve each and every user.

You will also find the grading syllabus, including photos of your kata, downloadable by grade. This information is all free to our members.

There are also books and DVDs available to help you with your home study.

The DVDs include the syllabus range, which basically show you what you have to know for each belt exam. For the most part these are "one grade per DVD", all the way up to brown belt. **Syllabus DVDs** are normally £15.

There is also a range of Application/Self Defence material, which might not suit everyone as there is some serious subject matter covered.

The Book **Peaceful Mind** illustrates the applications to the Heian kata family and retails at £14.95

Iron Horseman shows you what Tekki Shodan can be used for in self defence at £14.95

Fortress Storming, the book that launched it all, is still available at £14.95 all about Bassai Dai, and Fortress Storming—the minor version is now available for those studying Bassai Sho.

The Pressure Point Guide for Martial Artists is our best-seller and has readers across the globe, sharing specialised pressure point information at £19.95, and there is a double DVD set at £29.95 that accompanies this book. Obviously, this is only for serious, mature, and advanced practitioners.

There are **Kata & Application DVDs** representing one kata per DVD. Each features an hour or so of tuition to help you understand what the kata are for. We start with Kihon and keep going. Many black belts try to buy a "high grade" kata DVD first. They should understand that the foundation to most of our principles of application are on the first disc—Kihon. These retail at £19.95. Clare Potter sensei, Ross Chesterton sensei, and John Burke sensei get together to present the DVD

Women's Self Defence at £19.95. The simple techniques on this one are the core of self protection and especially necessary in this day and age.

All in all, this represents a huge collection of work. Over 30 DVDs and 5 major books as well as the free information on the website. Don't miss out, use this collection to your advantage!

Why Seminars?

You could just as easily ask "why not?" For many people training in Karate is something that they do a couple of times per week for exercise or a nice hobby. For others it becomes a quest for knowledge and experience. We seek out instruction, correction, and always yearn for more.

Some say that training with the Karate Academy instructors is quite enough. You are fortunate to have a club where the instructors are as knowledgeable and able as they are. Some would say that the instructors are this good <u>because</u> of the seminars they have been to.

To appreciate the importance of guest instructors it becomes important to recognise that the Karate Academy allows you train with people outside of your own club. That might seem natural and right (it certainly does to us!), but please appreciate that there are clubs where you are NOT allowed to train with other instructors. Where you are not permitted to do anything other than what the instructor tells you. WE see this activity as blinkered and ignorant. They see it as protectionist. The other factor is that generations of martial artists are disappearing. If you began your training in the last 7 years then you have not had the opportunity to train with Enoeda sensei. He has passed. The man who bought Karate to Britain was Vernon Bell. You cannot meet him now-he's passed. If you have only trained for 22 years then you never got to meet Nakayama sensei. He passed away in the 80s. And even John Burke sensei never got to meet Funakoshi himself. So we go out of our way to bring you the best and the important from the world of martial arts. We do that at

great expense and through much organisation to continue with our own education and also so that you, too, will have your dojo tales to tell when you are teaching Karate or simply reminiscing with "the old boys" in 40 years

Yes, you should get as much as you can from your regular instructors, they are some of the best around, not just in the UK but worldwide. Then you should also take advantage of our special guests, for their experience, their abilities, their different take on what makes a

class and what makes a seminar.

In recent times you have had the opportunity to train with Martyn Harris 4th dan sensei of Okinawan Kempo from Cardiff; Neil Ellison 5th dan sensei of Wado Ryu from Teesside; Tino Ceberano 9th dan sensei of Goju Kai from Australia/Hawaii/ Philippines; and now we are bringing you Patrick McCarthy 8th dan hanshi of Koryu Uchinadi from Australia; Terry Wingrove 8th dan hanshi of Jutsu from all over the world; and Anthony Blades 6th dan renshi of Karate from Sunderland/Moreton and Russell Stutely 6th dan renshi of OCFM from Oakham.

How many of them will you get to train with? You would benefit in different ways from each of them, and none of them runs the same kind of class as you get regularly. *Participate to Accelerate!*

Training outdoors is great fun; for a Gasshuku the training is all about the austere environment. We take a weekend away, spend some time together, do some training, and have a good time.

We arrive in Brecon at a converted barn on Friday 6th August (straight after Summer School). You will have to book up fast if you expect a room, or you can bring a tent and camp outside. August 7th and 8th we'll be training and eating together, and then the long drive home after the fun on the Sunday. We all get stuck in and really get immersed in our Karate.

There will be students from the *Keiko* group of clubs (us) and from *Martyn Harris's Red Dragon Karate Institute*, and from *Martyn Skipper's Tower Shukukai* as well.

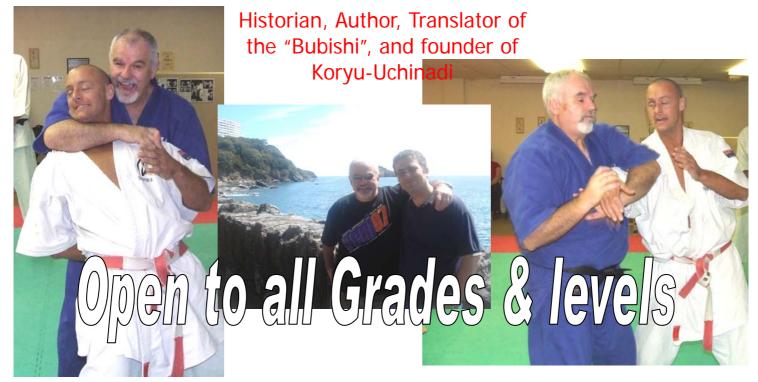
